Things to remember...

Please do not park your car in the horse-shoe area outside of the school gates. We appreciate that parking outside school can be a challenge but this area needs to be kept clear for emergency vehicles.

If your child is unwell please keep them at home and let the preschool know. If your child has sickness diarrhea they should not return to preschool until 48 hours after the last time they were sick; if your child has been given calpol on a morning they would normally attend preschool, they should remain at home and if your child has a continuous new cough, high temperature and/or cold symptoms they should also remain at home.
