- Our tables are adjustable and allow us the flexibility to position them at the height required for individuals.
- When needed we seek funding to support children with any additional developmental needs.
- We work alongside other professionals to gain and build our knowledge and deliver the necessary support for individual families and children.

- We have social activities during the year where all families using the setting can get involved in the preschool life, i.e. fundraising events, open days, trips.
- Staff and committee show the same amount of respect to all who use our service, role modelling to others expected behaviour.
- Where possible options on times, places and events are given to all who use the service to ensure that if we don't meet one group's needs at one time, we can meet them the next time we organise something.
- For children whose parents/carers are unable to attend events due to other commitments, the children are supported by the staff.
