What we are up to

We would like to extend a welcome to all our new families that have joined us, and welcome back to the children and families who have stayed with us. We hope you all had a lovely summer break.

This is our newsletter, which we send out half termly, to keep you up to date with what the preschool is doing, let you know of some dates for your diaries and provide some gentle reminders of what you can do to help the preschool run smoothly.

Things to remember...

Please do not park your car in the horse-shoe area outside of the school gates. We appreciate that parking outside school can be a challenge, but this area needs to be kept clear for emergency vehicles.

If your child is unwell, please keep them at home and let the preschool know. If your child has sickness or diarrhea they should not return to preschool until 48 hours after the last time

they were sick; if your child has been given calpol on a morning they would normally attend preschool, they should remain at home and if your child has a continuous new cough, high temperature and/or cold symptoms they should also remain at home. This will help protect us all. Thank you.

The children have settled well on their return to preschool, and we are enjoying getting to know them and seeing how much returning children have grown and developed over the summer.

The New operating hours for Preschool

Beginning this year we have combined all of our age groups so that 2, 3 and 4 years olds can attend from 8.30 - 4pm Monday to Friday. This is so that we can offer eligible families with 2 year olds, 15 hours free childcare when it becomes effective next April.

As a consequence of this change we have less preschool spaces available. In the past we have been

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flexible, allowing parents to change and swap days at notice, however moving forward this is not going to be possible. We will send out forms towards the end of each term asking reconfirm vour requirements for the next term. We do appreciate that personal circumstances can change and we will try to accommodate you all as best we can but apologise now if we are unable to do so.

Funding

Preschool funding currently available for 3 and 4 year olds. This consists of hours universal entitlement for all children which becomes available the term after their 3rd birthday. In addition, for working parents this can be extended to 30 hours per week. Currently 2 year old funding is available only to parents claiming those benefits. However this is set to change in April next year. To keep up to date with what you are entitled to go to the childcare choices website www.childcarechoices.gov. uk

Did you know that we may be entitled to £300 additional funding to improve the education of your 3 or 4 year old? This is called Early Years Pupil Premium, EYPP and to find out if you qualify call the Family Information Service
