We started off the term with the topic 'Healthy Me' where the children learnt how to care for their teeth, engaged in various physical activities learning about the benefits, they practiced personal hygiene routines and learnt about healthy foods, making fruit kebabs and quiche.



Our second topic of the half term was 'Story telling' we focused on the stories Goldilocks and the Three bears and The Three Little Pigs. The children brought in a teddy from home which they enjoyed sharing at our Teddy bears picnic with the group. We retold the stories repeatedly through roleplay and small world learning the sequence and repeated refrains. We used various construction to build homes for the pigs and enjoyed trying some porridge for snack.



We celebrated 'Chinese New Year' next. The children worked together as a group to junk model a Chinese dragon, we had lots of fun making our own dragon dances. For snack time we tried vegetable spring rolls, noodles in black bean sauce and prawn crackers. Our focus story was 'The Great race' which we acted out both with small world and role playing, discussing feelings and number sequencing.



We finished the half term celebrating 'Shrove Tuesday' and 'Valentine's day'. The children had the chance to make and try pancakes with a choice of toppings. We focused on the story 'The Big Pancake' trying hard to remember the sequence of people/animals and joining in with the repeated refrains. We made cards which we posted to the ones we love.



Our next planned topics and celebrations are 'Life cycles', Mother's day', 'World book day', 'Science week' and 'Easter' to finish off the term.

We are excited to share we have eggs at preschool and are hoping to watch them hatch into fluffy chicks! A massive Thank you to Dani Edwards for sorting this out for us.

Once a month we will post our "Wish Tree". This is our way of asking for small donations of items for snack, like apples or bread sticks, daily cleaning products like anti-bacterial spray or resources we can use for messy play like shaving foam or cornflour. If you are able to help by donating one of the items listed it helps to keep some of our costs down. Look out for the post and thank you in advance for your support.

Please do not park your car in the horse-shoe area outside of the school gates or in schoolThings tocarpark. We appreciate that parking outside school can be a challenge, but this arearemember...needs to be kept clear for emergency vehicles, buses and deliveries.

If your child is unwell, please keep them at home and let the preschool know. If your child has sickness or diarrhea they should not return to preschool until 48 hours after the last time it occurred; if your child has been given Paracetamol on a morning they would normally attend preschool, they should remain at home and if your child has a continuous new cough, high temperature and/or cold symptoms they should also remain at home. This will help protect us all. Thank you.

FundingPreschool funding is currently available for 3 and 4 year old's. This consists of 15 hours<br/>universal entitlement for all children which becomes available the term after their 3<sup>rd</sup><br/>birthday. In addition, for working parents this can be extended to 30 hours per week.<br/>Currently 2-year-old funding is available only to those parents claiming benefits.<br/>However, this is set to change in April. Did you know that we may be entitled to £300 additional funding to improve the education of your 3 or 4 year old? This is called Early Years Pupil Premium, EYPP and to find out if you qualify call the Family Information Service on 0344 800 8020 or go to www.norfolk.gov.uk/eypp
